
The Septuagint with Apocrypha: Greek and English Hardcover – April 1, 1986




Theological Wordbook of the Old Testament Oct 1, 2003


An Introduction to the Old Testament: Second Edition Dec 3, 2006






New Testament Introduction (Master Reference Collection) Hardcover


A Theology of the New Testament Paperback – September 2, 1993


The Comprehensive New Testament Hardcover – January 2, 2009
